Or very close to being free!

Lakeridge Winery & Vineyards – Clermont

Complimentary Tours and Wine Tasting are offered seven days a week. Your personal Tour Guide will show you the production area and the view of the vineyards where the grapes are grown and harvested. The Wine Tasting is held at the large tasting counter. A selection of award winning wines ranging from dry to sweet with sparkling are usually offered.

Old Town – Orlando

Visit this unique amusement park on Saturdays for a vintage-car parade or on Wednesdays to see The Dukes, a '50s and '60s cover band. Visitors must buy tickets for the amusement rides, but admission to Old Town, and its concerts and car shows, is free.

Orlando Brewing Company – Orlando

Orlando Brewing Company is the only certified organic brewery in Florida. They offer free tours at 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday. They also offer free entertainment on the weekends.

Charles Morse Museum – Winter Park

The Morse Museum of American Art has one of the most comprehensive collections of work by Louis Comfort Tiffany. The Museum also features a chapel interior designed for the 1893 World's Colombian Exposition in Chicago. The museum is free and has free concerts during parts of the year.

Popcorn Flicks in the Park – Maitland

Visit Maitland's Enzian Theater on the second Thursday of each month for Popcorn Flicks, a free classic movie series in Central Park.

Museum of Florida Art – DeLand

The museum is home to several rotating exhibits, gallery talks and receptions, educational programming, master artist workshops and special events throughout the year.

Cornell Fine Arts Museum – Winter Park

The Cornell Fine Arts Museum is home to several historical works and guests can see the exhibits free of charge. The museum is closed on Sundays.

Portofino Bay Hotel – Orlando

If you're visiting Orlando, enjoy an Italian music performance, free of charge.

The performances take place each night at sunset. The hotel has been recognized as one of the most elaborate themed hotel environments in the United States.

Kelly Park, Rock Springs – Apopka

In this 245-acre park, you can take a dip in the free-flowing natural spring, camp, hike, look for wildlife and more. Admission isn't quite free, but it's only \$3 for a vehicle of one to two people; \$5 per vehicle of three to eight people.

Daytona Flea Market – Daytona Beach

Voted one of the Top 5 Markets in the Country by USA Weekend, this market offers goods from over 600 vendors and 1000 booths. There is also a classic car cruise each month.

Black Hammock Adventures – Oviedo

Guests can enjoy free alligator and bird exhibits, watch trainers feed the 12-foot, 650-pound alligator (Sun. afternoons only) and listen to free live music at the restaurant (Fri. and Sat. nights only).

Disney's Boardwalk – Lake Buena Vista

Stroll along Disney's Boardwalk, which is a re-creation of a 1930's-style Atlantic coastal village. Stretching a quarter-mile, you can enjoy the free street musicians, magicians and performers.

FleaWorld and FunWorld – Sanford

Visit one of the largest flea markets in the U.S., where more than 1,700 vendors sell bargain-priced items. Fleaworld is open Friday to Sunday.

Harry P. Leu Gardens – Orlando

Story time! Take your young children to the garden for free storytelling on the third Monday of every month. Bring children under 18 months at 10 a.m., toddlers at 10:20 a.m., and three and four-year-olds at 10:40 a.m. Park attractions include a butterfly garden, a two-acre) tropical stream garden, bamboo and palm gardens, and a house museum dating to the 1880's.

Admission to the park is free from 9 a.m. to noon on Mondays.

Fort Christmas – Christmas

Twenty minutes east of Orlando in Titusville is Fort Christmas Historical Park, a full-size replica of Fort Christmas, originally built for the Second Seminole Indian War (1835-1842). The Fort has several historical structures and many pioneer demonstrations, like musk and cannon firings. There are also craft fairs throughout the year. Closed Mondays and holidays.

The Fred Stone Theatre at Rollins College – Winter Park

The theater hosts a student-produced "Second Stage Series" that is free. Evening performances are Wednesday to Saturday, with matinees on Saturday and Sunday.

Grand Bohemian Gallery – Orlando

You don't have to be a guest at the hotel to tour the gallery. Featured in the gallery is The Kessler Collection, established by art enthusiast Richard C. Kessler. The pieces displayed are original and rare pieces of artwork ranging from oil paintings, glass, wood, contemporary jewelry, bronze sculptures and unique gift items within the galleries as well as throughout his luxury hotels.

Lake Eola Park - Orlando

Did you know that Lake Eola is actually an 80-foot sinkhole? The park is 43-acres and is right in the heart of Downtown Orlando. You can take a jog around the lake, enjoy a concert or play in the amphitheater or stop by the farmers market on Sundays.
